Drowning	 Students to be competent and screened for water safety Constant supervision from coaches Students to be attached using leg rope Maintain coach to student ratio 1:8 Coaches to define activity area Students identifiable in coloured rash vest Students instructed on water safety and assistance procedures Coaches current in water rescue and CPR 	Rare	Catastrophic	Moderate
Slipping/Tripping	 Maintain activity in designated area Area clear of obstruction 	Unlikely	Minor	Low
